Quotes from Pope Francis' Encyclical "Laudato Si" - "Our Common Home"

Pope Francis on the Environment:

The poor are hurt the most by climate change. Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry. They have no other financial activities or resources which can enable them to adapt to climate change or to face natural disasters, and their access to social services and protection is very limited.

Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: Why is there such a collection? Every year, the Bishops of Canada make an appeal for financial assistance to support their work and the work of each diocese by means of the Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada. The President of the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB), the Most

Reverend Paul-André Durocher, Archbishop of Gatineau, has described this Collection as "an opportunity to all the faithful to help their dioceses collaborate in financing the regional episcopal assemblies (the Atlantic, Quebec, Ontario, and the West) and also the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (CCCB). These associations support the Bishops in their local ministry and in working together on issues of common concern." Any additional revenues raised help the diocese support its own diocesan pastoral programs and other activities. The CCCB is the national assembly of the Catholic Bishops in Canada, and includes the Bishops of the Eastern Catholic Churches. The Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada will be held September 26 and 27, 2015. Through your contribution to the Collection, you too can collaborate with the Bishops in their ministry to teach, sanctify and govern.
