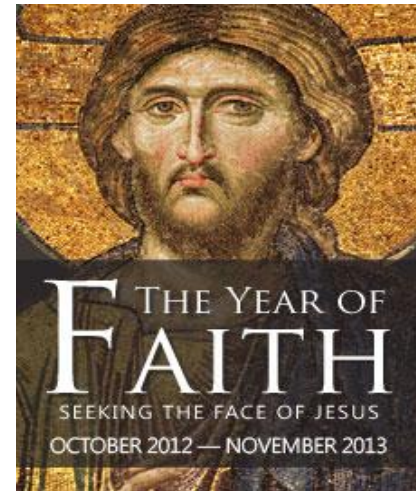

Thought for the Week:

Right faith is of necessity required for Baptism, since it is said: "the justice of God is by faith in Jesus Christ" (Romans 3:22) ... Therefore, Baptism without faith avails nothing and thus we must recall that without faith no one is acceptable to God.

Reflection Special significance is to be

seen in the fact that Jesus submitted to the baptism of John, which was a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. John called a sinful and self-righteous people to turn quickly before an impending judgment descends. "Already the axe is laid to the root of the tree." Matthew's narrative focuses on the issue of Jesus going for Baptism and John the Baptist attempts to protest the inappropriateness of Jesus coming to be baptized. The baptism of Jesus marks his solidarity as the messianic servant with his people. He takes upon himself by this cultic act their condition and their predicament. He becomes their representative. Coming to them and speaking to them he takes his place with them. Incarnation is not only coming to earth but also assuming the burden of life in the flesh. He not only speaks to them but also speaks for them. The Father's Son becomes the intercessor to the Father. The significance of the baptism of Jesus is explained by Paul: "He who knew no sin became sin for us in order that in him we might become the righteousness of God"
