

<u>Reflection</u>

If the election of Pope Francis has marked a new era in the life of the Church (and beyond) because of his origin and also in the name he chose, showing us a spirituality that he perhaps aims to bring in his pontificate, we have to remember that Holy Week has marked a new era in the life of the World.

This week is unique among all the 52 weeks that make up our calendar. It shines above all the others because this week was a week of change for the world. There will be a before and an after that week however not in a visible way. No one could have predicted this, just like with the election of Pope Francis. It was the way God chose to realize the most important change on earth, from the beginning of creation to the end through a sacrifice, a life given voluntarily for the salvation of all. That is why this week is so special and we must make it special through our prayers and sacrifices. And it will be so little in comparison with what we have received and continue to receive since every time I receive the Sacraments, I remember that it is thanks to the death and resurrection of Jesus that these Sacraments are given to me.

- ❖ It is a traditional doctrine of Christian spirituality that

a constituent part of repentance, of turning away from sin and back to God, includes some form of penance, without which the Christian is unlikely to remain on the narrow path and be saved (Jer. 18:11, 25:5; Ez. 18:30, 33:11-15; Joel 2:12; Mt. 3:2; Mt. 4:17; Acts 2:38). Christ Himself said that His disciples would fast once He had departed (Lk. 5:35). The general law of penance, therefore, is part of the law of God for man.

- Fasting: The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity.
- Abstinence: Abstinence from eating meat.
 Abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash
 Wednesday and on the Friday of the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ.
