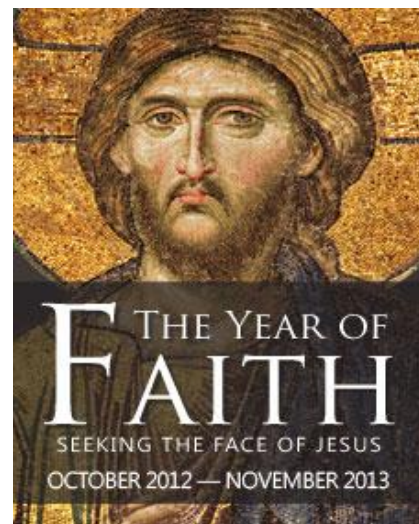

Reflection

At the Closing Mass of the 28th World Youth Day, held at Copacabana Beach in Rio de Janeiro, Pope Francis invited the youth present to "Go, do not be afraid and serve. Over 3 million pilgrims from all over the world were present at the Mass. "Faith is a flame that grows stronger the more it is shared and passed on, so that everyone may know, love and confess Jesus Christ, the Lord of life and history," the Pope said.

"Careful, though! Jesus did not say: "If you would like to, if you have the time," but: "Go and make disciples of all nations." Sharing the experience of faith, bearing witness to the faith, proclaiming the Gospel: this is a command that the Lord entrusts to the whole Church, and that includes you; but it is a command that is born not from a desire for domination or power but from the force of love, from the fact that Jesus first came into our midst and gave us, not a part of himself, but the whole of himself, he gave his life in order to save us and to show us the love and mercy of God."

"The Church needs you, your enthusiasm, your creativity and the joy that is so characteristic of you." Do Not Be Afraid

Pope Francis told the youth that despite fear they might have of announcing the Good News because of youth or inexperience, God still calls them and does not abandon them just as with the prophet Jeremiah. "When we go to proclaim Christ, it is he himself who goes before us and guides us," the Holy Father said. "When he sent his disciples on mission, he promised: "I am with you always." And this is also true for us!

Jesus does not leave us alone, he never leaves you alone! He always accompanies you." Regarding service, the Holy Father said that the act of serving others is a way of allowing our own lives to be identified with Jesus' life. The 76 year old Pontiff drew from the example of Saint Paul who made himself "a slave to all." "Evangelizing means bearing personal witness to the love of God, it is overcoming our selfishness, it is serving by bending down to wash the feet of our brethren, as Jesus did," the Pope said. Concluding his homily, Pope Francis appealed to all youth to announce the Gospel which he said is bringing God's power "to pluck up and break down evil and violence. "The Church is counting on you!" he exclaimed. "The Pope is counting on you!" From Website.
