



Reflection

If you want to have no challenges in your life, if you do not want to be bewildered by God, stay away from God. Otherwise, you might feel threatened and not at ease with Him and his teachings. Jesus did not come specifically to challenge us. But If God is challenging us in our life or if God is challenging our life, we can be certain that He has a purpose. He wants us to open our eyes. Because of the original sin, God has come to make things new: new but not by destroying but by transforming. This is the originality of Christianity, his beauty and strength. It is not a question of starting over but starting again in a new way.

The Lord is telling us in the Gospel that he has come to bring a fire on earth. A fire has a purpose as well as in the bible water has a purpose: both can give life and both can destroy. Both have a transforming power. Water is used during baptism to give us a new life, God's life and fire is give at Pentecost, for a new life as well without fear. Do not fear this fire, but "fire" this fear in your life.
