Christ the King:

We begin our lives as Catholics with Christ coming in us at Baptism. From that day on Jesus can come into our hearts and minds if only we invite him in. We need to dedicate our families and our lives to Jesus Christ every day, that he may bless us in every way, and be our King and center of our hearts.

Jesus is proclaimed to be a King, and this was really not by the Romans who placed a sarcastic sign over his head, "This is the King of the Jews." On the cross, Jesus was proclaimed to be a King by one of the criminals dying with him. "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." Why would this man condemned call Jesus a King? What did he realize that so many others had blocked out of their lives? Jesus possessed the Power of the Spiritual, the Power of God. Jesus demonstrated this power when he turned to the repentant criminal and said, "This day you will be with me in Paradise."

Christ most regal moment: reigning on the Cross sacrificing himself for others, reconciling, forgiving. We are called to realize with our lives the Kingdom of truth and life, holiness, grace, justice, love and peace.

Pope Pius XI instituted the feast of Christ the King in 1925 to remind Christians that their allegiance was to their spiritual ruler in heaven as opposed to earthly supremacy.
