Reflection for the Third Sunday of Advent, 2013.

St. James says that the hardest teaching can bear the most precious fruit, be patient. When we come closer to Christmas Day we find many people in panic. Many would say that they still have many things to be done and that the days are passing by. Yet the greatest preparation of ourselves for this great day some keep as the last thing on our, to do list and then get impatient with everyone and everything that comes in their way.

St. John the Baptist is preparing his disciples for the time that he will not be there with them. He sends them to Jesus to find out things for themselves but he tells them to ask Jesus some questions. "Are you the one who is to come or should we to look for someone else". Jesus wants them to answer those questions themselves stating the facts what they have witnessed not so much as a comforting answer. This makes the disciples think why is he saying this to us?
