

Epiphany of the Lord

Epiphany means manifestation. What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him.

Reflection

The Solemnity of the Epiphany

The Feast of the Epiphany is also known as the Feast of the Magi, the Three Kings. These were men skilled in philosophy, medicine and natural science. They possessed a love for learning and a desire to know more about the created world.

The Magi show us that a sincere, in-depth investigation of the natural world can lead a person to God. The Magi made that journey and they found the greatest prize in worshiping Jesus. They laid their treasures at his feet. Gold represents wealth and power; Frankincense and myrrh and received in turn the greatest treasure - the one that lasts. They then returned to their land, not guided by stars but more directly by God. They had looked upon the sun and they knew that the stars – beautiful as they are, dim by comparison to the radiance that the child Jesus had put in their hearts.

Pope Benedict commented on Heisenberg's statement: "There can't be anything more than this, now we know everything." The Pope concluded, "as soon as one recognizes the incomparable grandeur of the whole, one's vision penetrates farther and the question arises about a God who is at the origin of all things." Maybe we too can see the light of God in our hearts, minds and lives. May we like the Magi be led by the star to Bethlehem to encounter the greatest person Jesus born for us in the Manger that like the Magi's we too may see the light to spread the peace and love of Christ in the world and in the hearts of all we encounter in our lives.
