<u>Reflection</u>

Holy Week! This is a time for us to prepare our hearts and meditate on the mystery of humiliation and exaltation, the agony of Christ's Passion and death while we awaiting his joyous Resurrection. This week begins with Palm Sunday, continues with Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and ends with Easter Sunday.

On Palm Sunday we commemorate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem on a donkey, a symbol of humility and peace, while the crowds spread their cloaks and palm branches on the street indicating that

the king or dignitary was arriving in victory or triumph. The shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David" and "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" as the people honour Christ as their longawaited Messiah and King. Pope Benedict XVI speaking to the Youth in Rome on Palm Sunday 2007, said: "In the Palm Sunday procession we join with the crowd of disciples who in festive joy accompany the Lord during his entry into Jerusalem. Like them, we praise the Lord with a loud voice for all the miracles we have seen, how he gives men and women the courage to oppose violence and deceit, to make room for truth in the world; to bring about reconciliation where there had been hatred and to create peace where enmity had reigned. The Pope stressed three characteristics proclaimed by the church; poverty, peace, universality these are summarized in the sign of the cross. The cross needs to be the centre of our lives.

On *Holy Thursday*, Christ instituted the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist for all times and people and he established his presence among us. Praying at the Eucharistic vigil until midnight on this day is overwhelming. On *Good Friday* we relive the Passion and Crucifixion of Jesus by which he Redeemed us all and taught us to forgive others by his eternal words, "Father forgive them". The life of Jesus did not end on the cross; he rose again on Easter Sunday to give us the assurance of the Resurrection of the dead and life in the world to come. Heaven.
