

Pope Francis on the Environment:

<u>Drinking Water is a Human Right</u> One particularly serious problem is the quality of water available to the poor. Even as the quality of available water is constantly diminishing, in some places there is a growing tendency, despite its scarcity to privatize this resource, turning it into a commodity, subject to the laws of the market. <u>Yet access to safe drinkable water is a basic & universal human right, since it is essential to human survival, and as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights.</u> Our world has a grave social debt towards the poor who lack access to drinking water because they are denied the right to a life consistent with their inalienable dignity.
