#### 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, we hear about an encounter between Jesus and some Sadducees.

Jesus argues from the same written Law of Moses to show that there is resurrection. Using the texts from the Book of Exodus (<u>Chapter 3</u>) that describe Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush, Jesus shows that God is the God of the living, not the dead. Here Jesus uses the same method and texts of the Sadducees to counter them. As the Gospel text suggests, he beat them at their own game!

In the context of Luke, today's Gospel appears near the end of Jesus' teaching in Jerusalem, just prior to the events that will lead to his crucifixion. His warnings and predictions are ominous but can be read in many ways. ...

Ultimately, Jesus will witness to this with his own death. As disciples of Jesus, we try to follow his example, trusting in God's mercy and protection, even when we are facing difficulties.
